FAITHFUL FOR A LIFETIME

When I traveled to South Carolina for a women's program, I had the joy of meeting Carolyn Torrence—a woman whose life quietly tells a powerful story of faithfulness.

For more than 50 years, Carolyn has served as the secretary at Mt. Tabor Lutheran Church in Mt. Tabor, South Carolina. Her ministry extends far beyond a desk and a job description. Over the years, she also served faithfully at the South Carolina Synod Office (ELCA) and continues to teach adult Sunday School, nurturing faith and grounding others in God's Word.

Now 94 years old, Carolyn radiates joy. There was a gentleness and warmth about her that made it immediately clear: this is someone who loves the Church and loves serving God's people. During our time together, she lamented that she can no longer continue in her role as secretary.

What stood out most was not the ending of a role, but the enduring call that remains.

Carolyn's story is a reminder that our service to God's kingdom is not defined by a single position or title. While one chapter may be closing, her life bears witness to a deeper truth: as long as we have breath in our bodies, God continues to use us for His kingdom work. Faithfulness does not retire. Calling does not expire.

Whether through decades of administrative leadership, teaching Scripture to fellow believers, or simply offering joyful presence and wisdom, Carolyn's life reflects the quiet, steady faith that sustains the Church across generations.

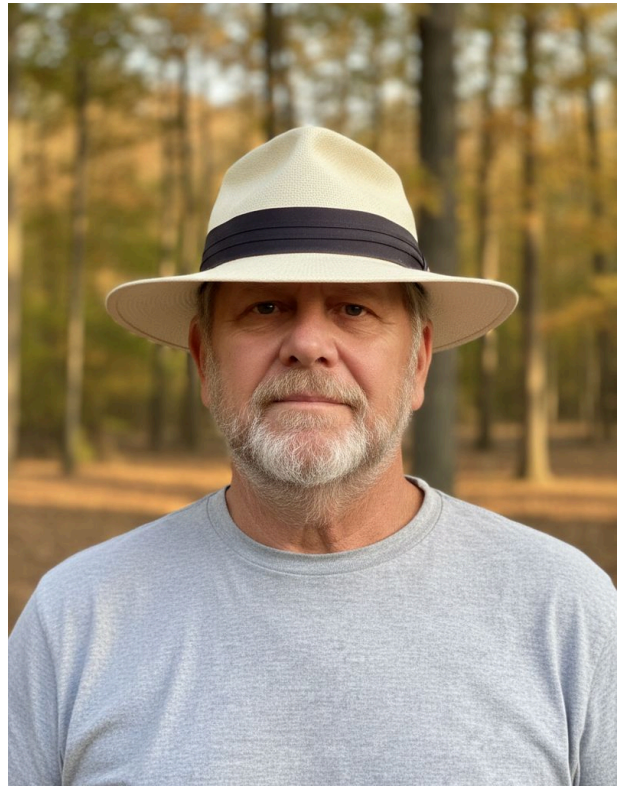

He was proud to be a retired pastor with the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America. Reverend Eargle enjoyed hunting and fishing. He loved helping others with projects and was an excellent story teller. He also enjoyed cooking and especially baking. Most of all, he was devoted to his wife Janie and to his family.

He is survived by his wife of 59 years, Janie Mayer Eargle; a son, David (Sarah) Eargle of Little Mountain; a daughter, Dee Ann (Dave) Tickner of Fincastle, VA; grandchildren, Alana (Owen) Eargle, Colin (Hailey) Tickner. Julia Eargle, and Gabriella Tickner.
